

Pastor's Study

Every time I open the door to what most people consider the 'Pastor's Office', I see two small signs. The bottom one reads 'PASTOR'. The top one declares 'STUDY'. The top sign reminds me that I'm to study the things of God- and not just occupy an office.

The Pastor's Study is a place to continually immerse myself in both God's written word and Christ's Living Word. I write sermons here. I ponder the things of our Triune God. I plan worship. I continue to grow in my Christian knowledge and faith.

The Pastor's Study is also a place to connect with other people physically, by phone, and digitally. It's where my well -worn Fellowship Directory resides. It's where I keep my Home Communion kit with its list of shut-ins. It's where I 'study' the joys and concerns of our congregation and offer support where I can. It's where I listen and counsel. It's where I pray for those mentioned during the Prayers of the People, for those listed on my 'more permanent' prayer sheets, and for upcoming events of the congregation.

The Pastor's Study is where I attend on-line Bible Study. It's where I join learning webinars and essential meetings. (During these Covid times, it's also where I link with my Community of Practice- and where I participated in General Synod!) It's where I grow in ministry and as a pastor. It's where I learn from my mistakes. It's where I plan for the future.

This Pastor's Study contains my desk which has become 'messier' over the years. For the first few years, it didn't hold a separate pile of music books. It didn't have a spot for cards sent by you. It didn't include an ever-increasing pile of ideas and 'information that might come in handy'. (That 'pile' has increased to include the wall beside the desk.)

This Pastor's Study connects me with other ministers who've served this congregation over the years. (Yes, I know that this addition wasn't built until 1968.) Their witness pervades the space and reminds me that I'm just one in a long line of those who've studied, learned, empowered, and envisioned for St. Paul's UCC.

This Pastor's Study is home to the two Christmas cacti from my first Sunday with you. It holds the books placed in my care by your previous pastor. It includes a helium kit and the basket for Confirmation folders. It displays family Bibles and religious items from two uncles who were UCC pastors. It exhibits a plate from your 130th Anniversary and the Bible verse picture you gifted me with on the 25th Anniversary of my ordination.

This Pastor's Study is a place of history, contrasts, and spiritual witness. It's a space that reminds me that I'm your Pastor and teacher. It comforts me when I'm afflicted and afflicts me when I'm comfortable. Surely God is in this place!

As we approach cold and flu season and increasing COVID cases in the area, we want to continue to keep our congregation healthy. If you have been exposed to a suspected or confirmed case of Covid, please stay home and worship with St Paul's virtually for 2 weeks. If you are having any cold/flu symptoms please stay home. We want to have the option to stay mask-free as long as possible. As always our policies may change as local and state guidances change.



January- the beginning of a new year and opportunity to make plans for your health status. Take this time to evaluate your health. Review your health history, add new diagnoses and/ or surgeries over the past year. Make sure to update your family regarding health conditions. Check your medicine cabinet- dispose of any old or not used medications- do not flush in toilet to prevent water system exposure. You can usually dispose of old medications in the pharmacy or at your health care provider's office. Also make note of any dental changes. Use this month to schedule annual physical and dental checkup. Don't forget your screening tests- mammogram, colonoscopy, prostate exam and eye exams,

Make a list of your health goals; whether to lose weight, exercise more, quit smoking, or just maintain your good health. Plan how to accomplish these goals. Always check with your health care provider before undertaking new exercise plans. Make a goal to eat healthy- get your fruits and veggies in daily, decrease your fat and sweets intake, increase your water intake (unless on fluid restriction by your provider), and walk or stretch daily. Track your progress on a calendar.

Take a moment every day for your mental and emotional health- the past couple years have been very taxing on our health. Write down your thoughts or concerns daily, keep track of the good things in your life. Keep your mind busy and active by doing mind exercises- crossword puzzles, word search, jigsaw puzzles, read the paper and new books. Keeping your mind busy and active helps to slow memory problems.

Get 7-8 hours good sleep at night; short naps during day are okay- help us to re- energize. Eat balanced meals and limit caffeine and alcohol intake.

Wash your hands frequently! Stay safe- you are a valuable and important person ♡□

Goals for 2022 – In the event we are unable to fill committee positions, changing the By-Laws was discussed. The requirements were reviewed with regards to making a change, and the timing required. We may plan to do this at a summer meeting Questions/Concerns – Everyone should get out their emergency lists and be prepared in the event we need to make calls due to bad weather.



Next meeting December 21, 2021at 6:30 p.m.


