The place where we are right is hard and trampled like a yard.

But doubts and loves dig up the world like a mole, a plow. And a whisper will be heard in the place where the ruined house once stood.

At the Annunciation of Christ's Birth, Mary is perplexed. She even asks the angel Gabriel, "How can this be?" (Luke 1.26-38). After Jesus' birth, the arrival of the shepherds- and their announcement of all they'd seen and heard- causes Mary to ponder these things in her heart (Luke 2.15-20).

Mary wonders. She questions. She ponders. She admits that she's perplexed. Mary has faith- as well as belief. Belief tells us that we should always have a ready answer. But life messes with belief. It invites us to have faith. Faith leads us to increase our trust in God. Faith prompts us to recall that we serve a God who dwells in mystery.

Once we agree to journey with God, we will face times of bewilderment. We'll have uncertainties. Our inherited belief system will be challenged. We can choose to double-down on our belief until the place we stand becomes trampled and hard. Or we can allow God to loosen up what we have stomped down, so that new growth can occur.

When we invite God into our lives, things tend to become messy. We realize that we're really not in charge. Yes, this can be scary. Yes, it can cause confusion. But when we allow awkward circumstances to question our inherited beliefs, then our faith can deepen and become more vibrant.

In 2023, maybe we can resolve to have faith like Mary. Maybe we can more faithfully trust our Creator. Maybe we can allow Jesus to be our pilot. Maybe we can invite the Holy Spirit to play a bigger role in our lives. Maybe we can more often glimpse the mystery in which our Triune God dwells.



January Parish Notes

January - the beginning of the New Year. A fresh start and clean slate. Take this time to address your health status. This is the time to make a plan and schedule to improve your health for 2023. Not complicated or difficult.

- Schedule a routine physical- the majority of insurances pay for annual exam. This usually includes fasting blood work to check cholesterol levels, thyroid function, blood count and glucose levels. Early detection of elevated blood glucose levels, which may indicate diabetes, can be addressed and improved with diet changes and increase in activity (no one wants to talk

about exercise!).

- Schedule a routine exam for mammogram or prostate exams. These are very important exams to detect any abnormalities. Early detection can lead to early treatments and possible resolution of problems.
- Dental care is an extremely important aspect of overall health. Periodontal disease can be treated effectively which will improve overall dental health.

Again, the majority of insurances cover routine dental care.

- Have you received your influenza vaccine this season? See your health care provider or pharmacist to obtain vaccination. Are you eligible for a pneumonia vaccine? Preventing pneumonia/decreasing infection is important to your health.

Make sure this is up to date.

- Make a realistic goal/ plan to improve your overall health. Eat a few more servings of fruits and veggies weekly, decrease fat and carb intake, cut back on salt, drink more water and less carbonated beverages, modify alcohol intake, slowly increase activity, decrease or stop tobacco use. Do these gradually over the course of the year; try to plan for monthly changes. Even a slight change will have an impact on your health.
- Don't forget to take time to enjoy life's pleasures and beauties. Watch a sunset, take a walk and see the beauty of nature, spend more time with family and friends. Expand your mind with reading, studying a new topic, or trying a new hobby. Open your mind and heart spiritually- this will improve your overall health.
