Like Jesus

In March, the Episcopal Church released the results of their *Jesus in America* study. Researchers surveyed a variety of Americans with diverse views, including non-Christians, in order to study common perceptions of both Christianity and Christians in the United States. Here's what they found.

Most Americans (84%) believe Jesus to be an important spiritual figure. A full 76% believe in the historical existence of Jesus of Nazareth. More than a third of the respondents said that Jesus' most important teaching is 'love your neighbor'. That was even the choice for a quarter of those who reported no religion. Another 20% chose 'not judging others, without first judging yourself'. Both those claiming no religion and those claiming Christianity gave that answer at the same rate.

However, when asked what characteristics they associate with Christians, the responses were quite different. Christian respondents chose words like giving, compassionate, loving, and respectful. Non-Christians chose words like hypocritical, judgmental, self-righteous, and arrogant.

Episcopal Church leaders say that this disconnect is the reason for the study. They hope that by better understanding public perceptions of Christianity, the church might be able to spread more effectively the message of Jesus' love and compassion. They want to affirm what it means to be Jesus' followers in today's world. They also hope to encourage all Americans to do a better job of loving their neighbor.

Here in the United Church of Christ, we claim Jesus Christ as our Savior and the Savior of the world. We also acknowledge him as the sole Head of the Church and Son of God. We less often consider him to be a good role model or great mentor. And despite the hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus", too often we keep him at a distance rather than using his life as an example of what we're to do.

And yet, we are the Body of Christ in the world today. We're not to answer Christ's call and then continue to serve our own selfish interests. Like Jesus, we're to worship God alone. Like Jesus, we're to show concern for our neighbor and the foreigner in our midst. Like Jesus, we're to be inclusive.

Like Jesus, we're to support social justice and work towards the common good. Like Jesus, we're to extend hospitality. Like Jesus, we're to welcome the stranger and heal the sick. Like Jesus, we're to feed the hungry and provide water to the thirsty. Like Jesus, we're to clothe the naked, care for others, and offer extravagant fellowship. "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these, you did it to me." (Matthew 25.40)

Jesus is our Savior. He's also our role model and our example of how we're to act. "The church is not a building. The church is not a steeple. The church is not a resting place. The church is the people." We're Christ's Body in the world today. May we more closely follow Jesus' example.



Arrive at Pastor Laurie's house (98 Prospect Street) any time after 5:30pm.



Next meeting May 15th after service.


