Council Minutes

April 24, 2022

Meeting was called to order at 11:12 a.m. by President, Marie Lowe.

Present: Marie Lowe, Pastor Laurie, Marilyn Wilson, Deb Best, Laurie Bellucci, Lorraine Wolf, Lisa Neary, David Williman, Chris Kipfer, Chris Eddy, Tom Baker, Jeff Peters, Mary West

Pastor Laurie led us in prayer.

Motion to accept the agenda was made by Lorraine Wolf, seconded by Deb Best, passed.

Motion to accept the March, 2022 minutes with corrections was made by Lorraine Wolf, seconded by Deb Best, passed.

Reports:

Deacons – July 17<sup>th</sup> we will have a supply minister. Updated membership list was distributed. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services were well received with very positive feedback. Mary West has May for ushers/greeters/layreaders. We are planning on combining our music books and making new ones.

Trustees – A new mower has been purchased. Mower schedule has been posted. Hardings is giving us an estimate for the front step. This will come out of property improvement. We are getting bids for carpet cleaning, and the parking lot will be resurfaced, patched and relined – both in June after pre-school lets out. May 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> will be property clean up at the church. Anyone is welcome to come and help. We are asking the kids to paint rocks to decorate the front.

Treasurer's report – was reviewed. We discussed the financial report going into the newsletter. It was decided to have a quarterly financial report in the June newsletter.

Christian Ed – Preschool may potentially add a p.m. class next year. We have 6 children registered for Dunkirk Camp. There is a need for funding to send kids to camp as Christian Ed's fundraising ran out last year, they no longer receive Women's Fellowship's donation of 1/3 of the cost, and the cost of camp has increased. Jeff Peters made a motion to pay \$670 for Dunkirk Camp, charging the expense to the Dunkirk Scholarship line, in addition to the \$500 already budgeted there, seconded by Lisa Neary, passed. Council will make sure the budget committee increases the Dunkirk Scholarship line for the 2023 year.

Pastor's Report – Three kids from St. Paul's and Pastor Laurie are going on the mission trip, with potentially four more children going. They raised more than \$800 from the scrapbook fundraisers.

Motion to accept all reports was made by Jeff Peters, seconded by Laurie Bellucci, passed.

Business:

John Brandon spoke to Council about the church's organ. There is a circuit board within the organ that serves as a surge protector that cannot be replaced. Council will need to make sure the breaker doesn't get tripped in the kitchen. Having said that, the organ does need to be serviced. Council approved to have the organ serviced.

Media Ministry – reviewed minutes from the 4/10/2022 meeting. Council is considering not putting scripture on the screens to decrease the amount of work being required. Discussion will continue on this subject.

Pancake breakfast brought in \$755. This will stay in the operating fund to be used for possible Ukraine support and/or seed money for the Sauerkraut Supper.

Sauerkraut Supper – we need a council sub-committee to meet apart from council for planning and carrying out the dinner. Committee will be David, Jeff, Tom, Laurie, Mary, Marilyn and Lisa.

June 5<sup>th</sup> picnic – We will have a "normal" – no sermon – church service. At the end of the service, council will give a semi-annual update including a safety and disaster update with instruction, and we will end with a fire drill. This will take everyone outside where we will have our picnic. This will be planned more fully in May.

Pictorial - We will probably do this in the fall.

AED pads are on backorder.

Copy company is having an open house to see machines June 9<sup>th</sup> from 11 – 5 – RSVP by June 6<sup>th</sup>. Get back to Laurie Bellucci if interested. There are consistent and continuing problems with the machine feeding ledger sized paper through it, even after it has been serviced for that problem.

Next meeting is May 15, 2022.

Jeff Peters made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Laurie Bellucci, passed.
